



Ulissi delivers for UAE Abu Dhabi with fifth place at Santos Tour Down Under

Fifth overall, Italy's Diego Ulissi (UAE Abu Dhabi) topped the tally of European riders with finishing fifth at the Santos Tour Down Under behind Australians Richie Porte, Jay McCarthy, Nathan Haas and the so-called "Colombian kangaroo" Esteban Chaves. For the team also two 4th places with Marko Kump, Diego Ulissi and Ben Swift and a third (Kump) in the final stage criterium in Adelaide.



Nettie Edmondson closes Santos Women's Tour with second place on final stage

Wiggle High5 Pro Cycling's Nettie Edmondson ended the 2017 Santos Women's Tour with a morale-boosting second place in the final stage criterium around Adelaide's Victoria Park. The Adelaidean former double Track World Champion was just unable to match the pace of Dutch powerhouse Kirsten Wild (Cylance Pro Cycling), but was able to hold off the challenge of two former black and orange riders, in Chloe Hosking (Alé-Cipollini) and Peta Mullens (Hagens Berman Supermint).

Having led Edmondson into the finishing straight, Wiggle High5 Pro Cycling debutant Grace Garner was able to continue her own sprint to take fifth.



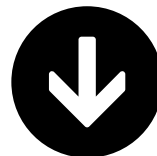
Gazprom RusVelo starts Australian campaign with a world tour race

At the beginning of the new season Gazprom – RusVelo took a trip to Australia for the first time in team history. Seven riders will participate in fast growing one-day Cadel Evans Great Ocean Race. This cycling event has been named after the first Australian winner of Tour de France, Cadel Evans. For the first time Cadel Evans Great Ocean Race was carried out in 2015. This year the race was upgraded to the World Tour status by UCI, which means that strongest cyclists in the world will take part in it.
