

Polanc 11th in the 100th Giro d'Italia

Mission accomplished: Jan Polanc defended his 11th place in the General Classification in the final stage of the 100th Giro d'Italia. In the final standing, the king of the Etna stage has a gap from the winner Tom Dumoulin of 18'06". Slovenian rider came 4th in the youth classification with teammate Simone Petilli in sixth.

Van Emden had a strong individual time trial, 29,3 km from Monza (Autodromo Nazionale) to Milan, finishing the stage in 33'08", 15 quicker than the second place which was taken by Dumoulin. Rui Costa was the fastest rider from UAE Team Emirates, finishing 42nd (+2'15").

UAE Team Emirates, the first Emirati team ever to participate in the Giro d'Italia, obtained the 2nd place in the final teams points classification.





Pavel Brutt marked his name in the anniversary Giro d'Italia

Even though this year Gazprom – RusVelo didn't manage to get a stage win, riders of the team were the most active breakaway specialists. Especially Pavel Brutt and Evgeny Shalunov having four breakaways each and forcing contenders to stay focused all the time. Pavel Brutt took over the breakaway classification having the most kilometers spent off the front of the peloton. Also Pavel was second in the intermediate sprint classification.

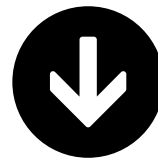
Longo Borghini and D'hoore headline strong Wiggle High5 team at Women's Tour

Wiggle High5 Pro Cycling's powerful team for the OVO Energy Women's Tour (7th-11th June) will be headlined by Elisa Longo Borghini and Jolien D'hoore, who have both enjoyed considerable success in Britain's biggest race. Longo Borghini finished third overall in the 2016 edition of the event, having been voted the most combative rider in the 2015 edition, while D'hoore won the second stage in 2015 and finished the race in second place overall.
